#### Residents Returning from Abroad

Residents who are returning from abroad need to take special precautions to protect their neighbours. If you are returning from abroad, do not take the Protection ferry. Arrange for passage in a private boat. The boat operator and passengers should wear masks and gloves. The boat operator should disinfect the boat after the passengers have disembarked. If you cannot arrange for a private boat, please contact Kevin Pistor at <a href="mailto:kpistor@telus.net">kpistor@telus.net</a> and he will try to connect you with a boat. #### **Boat Matching Service**

The tool will be advertised as soon as it is completed. It is proposed that the boat matching service be used when the ferry is not running, or if ferry service is cancelled.

#### Fire Ban in Effect

The City of Nanaimo has banned all backyard burning on Protection Island. There will be no burning this April as in previous years. The ban is meant to reduce the level of respiratory irritants in the air.

Due to the number of residents who are highly vulnerable to Covid-19, we think this is a fair and reasonable expectation. We will do everything we can to find a safe solution for everyone.

2. The Ferry Skipper is doing everything possible to safely provide transportation services. There is a certain level of trust in riders that they are observing the safety protocols, which by now should be well known and understood by all, as outlined by the Chief Medical Officer of BC, or as described on the BC Ministry of Health website at
