



In the Event of an EVACUATION

Please read this information carefully, make your family aware and **POST IN YOUR HOMES.**

Local EMERGENCY on Protection Island

- Should a local emergency occur on Protection Island that requires residents to evacuate, you will be alerted by either First Responders or the City of Nanaimo.
- Sign up for City Emergency Call Alert to get notified during emergencies (when cell service is up and running) To sign up <https://www.nanaimo.ca/city-services/emergency-services/emergency-management/emergency-call-alert-system> or call 250-758-5222 between 8:00 am and 4:30 pm Monday to Friday

Earthquake Event

- In the event of an earthquake residents should have an emergency kit and be prepared to support themselves for minimum of 7 days. When City is able – it will provide information through local radio stations 1023 the Wave and 1069 the Wolf.

LOCAL EMERGENCY SELF-EVACUATION

If you receive notice to evacuate and *you are able to evacuate on your own* please go to Visiting Vessel Pier. The City will be supporting the evacuation and will have resources and buses there to take you to a centralized location.

It is important to evacuate to this location as the City will be conducting headcounts to ensure all residents are accounted for. If you self-evacuate, please go directly to the Visiting Vessel Pier.



LOCAL EMERGENCY CANNOT SELF-EVACUATE

If you are unable to evacuate on your own, go to the safest "muster point", and help will eventually arrive to evacuate people gathered at those sites. Go to any one of the following four sites that you can get to safely.

- Northern Point: Pirates Causeway (between 50A and 52 Pirates Lane)
- Southern Point: Gallows Point (at 208 Colvilleton Trail)
- Eastern Point: Smugglers Park (at 86 Captain Morgan's Blvd.)
- Western Point: Pirates Park also known as Mud Bay (at 119A Pirates Lane)
